Phoenix's record streak of daily high temperatures over 110 degrees Fahrenheit (43.3 degrees Celsius) ended Monday as the extreme heat wave that roasted the Southwest throughout July receded slightly thanks to some much needed rainfall. The historic heat began blasting the region in June, stretching from Texas across New Mexico and Arizona, and even reaching into California's desert. Phoenix and its **suburbs** suffered more and longer than most areas, with a record-breaking 31 **consecutive** days of temperatures over 110 degrees Fahrenheit (43.3 degrees Celsius). The previous record was 18 straight days, set in 1974. The record-breaking streak finally ended on July 31, when the temperature peaked at 108 degrees Fahrenheit (42.2 degrees Celsius) in the late afternoon. As high as that sounds, it was only 2 degrees (1.1 degrees Celsius) above average for that time of year. The relief from extreme heat was expected to be brief, with the forecast calling for highs above 110 for several days near the end of the week.

The things we eat and drink, the way we travel, and the things we buy all have an impact on our environment. Do you worry about your personal ecological ①**footprint**. If you do and you want to reduce the impact you have on the environment, here are a few *relatively** easy things you can do at home. Turn off lights and devices when they are not needed. Run the washer or dishwasher only when full. Wash clothes in warm or cold water instead of hot water. ②**Adjust** your *thermostat** so that you keep the temperature a bit lower than you usually do in winter and a bit higher in summer.
